

Director's Note

For the past 13 years, Shakespeare in Detroit has dedicated itself exclusively to the works of William Shakespeare. From our humble beginnings as a grassroots effort called Shakespeare Against Cancer in 2012, to our groundbreaking Othello in the park the following year, every production we've mounted has been rooted in the Bard's canon.

But this time, we're changing things up.

With Jane Anger by Talene Monahon, we step boldly into new territory — what I like to call "Shakespeare-adjacent" work. Written during the pandemic of 2020 — an experience we all shared — Jane Anger brings Shakespeare to the stage once again, but this time, he's not the lead. The spotlight belongs to Jane.

Jane Anger was a real historical figure, though her precise identity remains uncertain. In Monahon's clever and courageous reimagining, Jane becomes the "Dark Lady" of Shakespeare's sonnets — a cunning

woman, a self-taught survivor, and a genius. She does what she must to endure a world that underestimates her. She never apologizes for her confidence, her audacity, or her sensuality. She speaks truth to power, refusing to be silenced in a society that seeks to keep women in their place.

Despite the barriers of race, gender, class, and a lack of formal education, Jane doesn't lean on those challenges as excuses. She leans into her brilliance. She takes a book gifted by the queen, teaches herself to read and write, and fights her way — sometimes literally, with a rapier — through London's chaos and plague to survive.

I see reflections of Jane's resilience in my own community. Like her, so many of us have had to rely on our ingenuity and courage just to persist. In a time when the voices of marginalized people are being threatened or erased, Jane Anger feels especially vital — a reminder of what happens when a woman claims her voice and refuses to apologize for her power.

I want to thank everyone who has supported

Shakespeare in Detroit through every stage of our evolution — from our early grassroots days, to our work in parks and site-specific spaces, to our educational program, Shakespeare STEAM, and now to this exciting new chapter as we expand beyond the Bard. Our mission has always been rooted in community, and we couldn't do this without you.

A special thank you to Morgan Breon, Creative Director of our I Am A Genius campaign, inspired by the wit and spirit of Jane Anger. For the past eleven weeks, this campaign has celebrated women in Detroit who embody genius in their own unique ways. Their portraits, created by photographer Chuk Nowak, are on display through October 25th at the Metropolitan Museum of Design Detroit. I invite you to visit the exhibit and learn more about these remarkable women — and about us — at shakespeareindetroit.com.

Thank you to our brilliant cast, crew, and everyone who poured their hearts into bringing this Michigan premiere to life. Now, sit back and enjoy a night of laughter, wit, and maybe even a little shock. But most of all, I hope you leave inspired to embrace your own

Character Breakdown

JANE ANGER

A cunning woman — healer, writer, and survivor. Bold, brilliant, and unapologetically outspoken, Jane Anger is determined to protect herself and her livelihood in a world that underestimates her. Often referred to as "the Dark Lady" of Shakespeare's sonnets, she's witty, sensual, and fiercely intelligent. She leans on no one but her own genius.

FRANCIS SIR

Shakespeare's peasant apprentice. Naïve yet insightful, Francis is a companion to William during the plague and an aspiring actor. He's curious and dutiful while also ambitious and trying to find his big break.

WILLIAM SHAKESPEARE

The Bard himself, though not as we've come to know him. In quarantine during the plague, he's egotistical, anxious, and creatively blocked. Beneath his vanity, however, lies a man struggling with irrelevance, haunted by his own insecurities.

ANNE HATHAWAY

Shakespeare's long-suffering wife, appearing unexpectedly in London. Sharp, sarcastic, and endlessly resilient, Anne brings both comic relief and emotional depth as she confronts her famous husband—and Jane—with truth, rage, and wit.

About the Play

Set during the plague in 1606, Jane Anger reimagines Shakespeare's world as he writes, or attempts to write, King Lear (E-A).

It's a fierce, funny, and feminist farce about art, authorship, and the audacity to speak one's truth.

Founded in 2012, Shakespeare in Detroit (SiD) began by bringing the power of classical performance to children and families in hospitals across the city. A year later, SiD made history with Detroit's first-ever Shakespeare company, becoming the city's only professional theatre company dedicated to Shakespeare and classical works.

Since then, thousands have experienced SiD's bold, high-caliber productions in parks, theatres, and unexpected spaces, all grounded in community, equity, and excellence. SiD's educational initiatives include Shakespeare STEAM, fusing arts and STEM learning in Detroit classrooms, and a Summer Conservatory that has awarded more than \$100,000 in scholarships to local teens.

Led by founder and director Sam White, a nationally recognized changemaker featured by the BBC, Forbes, The Guardian, and The New York Times, SiD has earned support from the Max M. and Marjorie S.
